Lesson Plan: Which Job Would You Want?

Best done after the lesson Identify Jobs

Objective:

Students will write an opinion piece stating which job they would prefer.

Outcomes: Students will...

- Decide, based on the information provided, which job they would prefer in the 1700s.
- Clearly state their opinion in writing & support with reasoning
- Conduct further research into their chosen 1700s job (optional)

Items Used:

• Job cards

Lesson:

Students write an opinion piece stating which job they would want if they lived in the 1700s, and why. They may use the occupation cards included with the program, and may also include further research conducted on the Internet or in the library.

Students can include:

- At least one tool they would use, or item they would make
- Who the customers would be
- The pros and cons of the job

Optional: Students also draw a picture of themselves doing this job.

Optional: Instead of a written piece, students create a multimedia presentation or a comic strip about their chosen job.
