4. Introduction of the topic:

These slide decks have been prepared for you to begin Day 1 with an overview of the 6 branches. What do they have in common? Who is eligible? Logos/seals/emblems. Benefits etc. Then Day 2-3-4 break down 2 forces per day. Each day includes: the purpose, the date it began, what the career path looks like, what kind of equipment is used, then has an in class activity & a home work assignment for each night. At the end of Day 4 there is a final project. Day 5 can be for the final challenge game & go over peoples choices or can be done on following Monday if people want to share

any with class of why they picked what or what the breakdown of class was ie: 20% Army, 10% Navy, 10% Airforce, 40% Space Force, 20% Marines.

5. **Procedure for instruction**:

Go thru power points and make sure that the talking points are in speakers notes are all you want to add in that slide, you as an educator might enjoy enjoy sharing your own tid bits so sprinkle them in. Also make sure you have gone thru the instructions & supplies needed for activities. Keep in mind, some of the homework requires internet access. If a student does not have internet access you will need to change that or make alternative arrangements.

6. Lesson closure:

I would ask if any of the students would be willing to share their final project. Tell the class what branch they picked & why or what job they might be interested in. If you don't want to use that much time, you could compare the round up numbers to how many students in your class selected each branch & see if they are comparable % wise.

7. Assessment of Understanding:

Come up with 30 questions from the slides. Break students into 2 groups. Ask each group a question, if the team answering gives the correct answer they get a point, if the incorrect answer is given, the opposing team gets to try to steal the point. Create a few hard questions for a bonus round with bonus points to create a winner.

What do they have in common?

Full time vs. Part-time

Full-Time position is considered Active Duty:

- living on base or in military housing
- totally immersed in military culture
- they have completed boot camp
- they are stationed at a base either domestically or overseas for two to six years*

^{*} may vary if deployed in an active military deployment

Full time vs. Part-time

- Part-time soldiers
 - Reserve
 - Must attend boot camp
 - Must train one weekend a month
 - Must train 2 weeks a year
 - National Guard
 - Split Training





Full time vs. Part time

- National Guard
 - Air
 - Army
 - Reports to state, not federal government
 - Must train one weekend a month
 - Must train two weeks a year
 - Primary focus is focus is on homeland security and humanitarian relief (like a state of emergency)
 - President can federalize, and send overseas, but normally stays in a humanitarian efforts



Full time vs. Part time

- Split Training
- Not applicable to all branches, only:
 - Army
 - Army National Guard
 - Coast Guard
 - Train 2 summers
 - Train one weekend a month
 - Then go into Guard status




Careers

- The United States Marine Corps functions as a unique force, combining ground, aviation and amphibious assets to defend our country and its interests.
- A Marine is primarily a warrior, skilled in the art of warfare.
- Being a Marine is not simply a job. It is a calling, and only those who prove themselves during the rigorous training have earned the right to wear the uniform.
- It was founded in 1775, but has been a component of the Navy since 1834.

- Marines fill many roles: Marine sniper, M1A1 Abrams tank crew, Amphibious Assault Vehicle (AAV) operator, mortar Marine, infantry assault, Amphibious Assault Vehicle (AAV) crewman, infantry Marine, scout snipers, aircraft maintenance, helicopter mechanic, aviation ordnance technician, aviation supply specialist, air traffic controller, helicopter crew chief, aviation ordnance, pilot, air traffic control, counter intelligence, logistics chief, military police, dog handler, cyber security, air delivery, ammunition tech, landing support, signals intelligence, and others.



What is Space Force?

- The United States Space Force (USSF) is the space warfare service branch of the U.S. Armed Forces. It is the sixth and youngest branch of the U.S. Armed Forces.
- Space Force is organized as a military service branch within the Department of the Air Force, one of the three military departments within the Department of Defense.





What is the mission for Space Force?

The U.S. Space Force's mission is to "organize, train, and equip space forces in order to protect U.S. and allied interests in space and to provide space capabilities to the joint force. Its responsibilities include developing military space professionals, acquiring military space systems, maturing the military doctrine for space power, and organizing space forces to present to the Combatant Commands".[6]

Structure of Space Force

- Air Force will recruit for now
- Will access officers same way as Air Force for now
- In summer 2020, the Air Force & Space Force have plans to make space-related tracks, and develop the model the Navy & Marines have.
- The Space Force will also continue to leverage the Defense Acquisition University to support general and space-specific acquisition training and certifications.




