





- 2. Several pension acts (1818, 1832; 1836) Do you have a basic understanding of the provisions of each act? [Rose, Military Pension Laws 1776-1858]
- 3. Did your ostensible soldier live beyond the date of the pension act under which he would have qualified?

## **Bounty Land**

## Federal or State bounty?

States that promised bounty land: GA, MD, MA,\* NY,

NC, PA, SC, VA

States that did <u>not</u> promise bounty land: CT, DE,

NJ, RI, VT

\*MA was the only state that did not allow veterans to claim both the federal and the state bounty

## **Bounty Land: Pitfalls**

- 1. Searching for bounty land for a militiaman
- 2. Searching for state bounty land when it was actually federal, and vice versa
- 3. Assuming that any land acquired immediately after the war was bounty
- 4. Assuming that a man who settled in a bounty land tract was a soldier



#### **Public Claims**

Virginia to break open "any house, barn, outhouse, mill, or storehouse, or other outhouses where any such enumerated articles may be suspected to be"

#### MAY 1780-4th of COMMONWEALTH.

And be it farther enacted, That if any person shall refuse to shew to the commissioners, when thereto required, his stock or quantity in possession, of any of the above enumerated articles, the said commissioners are hereby authorized and required to break open, in the day time, any house, barn, outhouse, mill, or storehouse, or other outhouses where any such enumerated articles may be suspected to be; and seize and take into his possession for the publick use of salted beef, pork, and bacon, the surplus; and of Indian corn, half the surplus; after leaving sufficient for the use of the family, or those in his or her service, to the first day of December next, of wheat, rye, oats, flour, rum, and other spirits, the surplus; after leaving sufficient for the use of the family to the first day of September, one
