Judy Callaway Ostler, a 44-year DAR member, currently serves on the National Board of Management as Vice President General. She serves as NSDAR President General Van Buren's appointed advisor to Kate Duncan Smith DAR School. She serves on the Executive Board at KDS School and is a member of the KDS Development Committee. Service to NSDAR includes National Vice Chair of Hospitality and Beautification, Vice Chair South Central Division for Lineage Research, and Registration and VIS National Congress Committees. She served seven years on the National Speakers Staff. She has served on the KDS Board of Trustees, Tamasee DAR School Regents Council and Advisory Board. She is a NSDAR Field Genealogist and has completed the New Horizons Course. She has participated in four National School Tours. She is a Life member of NSDAR Officer's Club, Vice Chair Association, Regents' Club and Vice Regents' Club where she served as President in 2014. Donor Memberships include Founders Club, Heritage Club, 1890 Giving Circle Guardian Trust and Sustaining Supporter. She has been a delegate to Continental Congress for 20 years.

State Service

Judy serves on the Texas State Society Executive Board. She is an Honorary State Regent of Texas, serving as Texas Regent 2015-2018. Her administration raised over \$1,726,600.00 for state projects which included \$1,157,275.00 for the NSDAR Guardian Trust Fund. She served fifteen years on the Executive Board as State Regent, Vice Regent, Chaplain, Registrar and Vice President General. She has won awards on the state level for outstanding work in Lineage Research and as State Outstanding Volunteer Genealogist. She served eighteen years on the State Speakers Staff. She is currently a member of the TXDAR Finance, Investment and Long-

range Planning Committees. She serves as State Chair of Marketing for “Courage, Charm and Character,” a Texas history book on the First Ladies of Texas written during her administration.

Judy is a graduate of the University of Texas in Austin and has a Master’s Degree from Texas Woman’s University. She attended the University of Liverpool in England. She is a member of the First United Methodist Church in Crocket where she teaches Bible classes, Sunday School , and chairs the Scholarship Committee. She is a seventh generation Texan.
