National Service:

Leslie served on the National Board of Management, 2016-2019. She currently serves as the Historic Preservation Committee, National Chair, 2019-2022. Past service includes National Vice Chair, Membership: Prospective Members, 2014-2016; Congress Vice Chair, Memorial Service, 2013-2016; and on the Credentials, Banquet, and Memorial Service Congressional Committees. She participated in the 2016 DAR Schools Tour and 2019 Hillside School Tour. She's a Sustaining Supporter and contributor to the Guardian Trust.

State and Chapter Service:

Leslie served as the State Regent of Kentucky, 2016-2019. Focusing on collections conservation, she created a new annual Heritage Preservation Symposium, a fundraiser to promote the Duncan Tavern Historic Center, KSDAR's State Headquarters. Over \$45,000 was raised from the symposiums and her State Regent's Project. These funded the professional conservation of six of the center's historic paintings; an historic Kentucky long rifle; and a \$10,000 upgrade to its security system. The Kentucky Historical Society honored KSDAR with the Kentucky History Award in Education for its 2018 Heritage Preservation Symposium.

During the Miller Administration, over \$90,000 was donated by KSDAR to Hindman Settlement School and gifts to the Kentucky Period Room, DAR Museum, included two circa 1831 portraits by a Kentucky artist and conservation funds. KSDAR sponsored a photo exhibition at the Kentucky Military History Museum showcasing photographs of WWI monuments and memorials in Kentucky and donated \$5,000 to the Lexington Fischer House.

Leslie created The Spirit of Kentucky Award to honor Kentucky citizens who have exhibited exceptional service in Education, Historic Preservation, & Patriotism. She served KSDAR as State Chaplain, 2010-2013; State Organizing Secretary, 2013-2016; State Chair, Chapter

Development & Revitalization, 2013-2015; and was Kentucky's State Outstanding Chapter Regent, 2009.

Joining as a junior member, Leslie is a 4th generation member of the Hart Chapter, organized by her great-grandmother in 1908. She was honored to serve as Chapter Regent during its centennial celebration, and as its Chapter Registrar and now Honorary Chapter Regent.

Non-DAR Information:

Community service includes leadership positions at church, Girl Scouts, Boy Scouts, the Junior Leagues of New Orleans and Milwaukee, and the Board of Liberty Hall Historic Site. Leslie is a graduate of H. Sophie Newcomb College, Tulane University, with a B.S. in physics. She was employed by Martin Marietta Manned Space Systems on the Space Shuttle External Tank, 1975-1992. Leslie lives in Louisville and is employed at NSSAR. She and her husband, Brett, have two grown sons and a daughter.
