Wendy served as State Vice Regent, and held several state chairmanships including Project Patriot, American History, Good Citizens, Media and Public Relations, and Junior Membership. She is also actively involved in the New Hampshire Cameo club, Officers club and Chapter Regents club.

Wendy is a member of the Exeter Chapter in Exeter, NH. She served as Chapter Regent, Vice Regent, and other positions.

Wendy is a family practice nurse and has been appointed by the Governor to the New Hampshire State Board of Nursing. She was selected for Who’s Who in Nursing in 2010.
