**STANDING RULES FOR THE
129TH CONTINENTAL CONGRESS ONLINE
THE NATIONAL SOCIETY OF THE
DAUGHTERS OF THE AMERICAN REVOLUTION**

Due to the nationally declared COVID-19 health pandemic and resulting stay-at-home restrictions, the National Board of Management invoked temporary emergency powers authorized within the Code of the District of Columbia Nonprofit Corporation Emergency Powers and exercised the authority granted to it in the National Society's Bylaws to approve conducting the 129th Continental Congress online. The National Board of Management will adopt the Credentials Committee Report, the Standing Rules, the Program (subject to changes that may be necessary) and any other necessary fundamentals of the 129th Continental Congress in order to officially open the Congress for business.

ELECTRONIC MEETING REGISTRATION

All Delegates and voting members shall have registered prior to the April 15, 2020 deadline set by the Bylaws of the National Society. All registration fees are waived.

Each member is responsible for her audio and internet connections; no action shall be invalidated on the grounds that the loss of, or poor quality of, a member's individual connection prevented participation in the meeting.

CREDENTIALS COMMITTEE

On Wednesday, June 24, prior to Opening Night, a Quorum Call will be issued. Each Delegate will be provided a unique Login ID and Password to confirm her presence for the meeting. It is the duty of any registered Delegate who is unable to perform her duties as a Delegate to inform the Credentials Committee no later than June 20 to allow time for the properly accredited Alternate to be: 1) registered as a Delegate and 2) receive her necessary Login ID and Password to access the electronic voting platform.

A daily tally of viewers from the online report log shall be included in the *Annual Proceedings of the National Society Daughters of the American Revolution One Hundred Twenty Ninth Continental Congress Online*.

DELEGATES

Voting will be conducted via the secure and anonymous voting portal *Simply Voting*. Registered Delegates and other registered voters will be

emailed the necessary reports and information relating to the motions to be considered, the candidates for office and instructions for online voting. Prior to the day of voting, each credentialed voter will be sent information, including a unique password, that will provide one-time access to the ballot. An anonymous vote conducted through the designated internet voting portal shall be deemed a ballot vote, fulfilling the bylaw requirement that a vote be conducted by ballot.

DEBATE AND MOTIONS

Only registered Delegates and other voting members of the Congress shall be entitled to make motions, debate and vote. A dedicated email inbox, monitored by the Recording Secretary General and National Parliamentarian, will be created to allow motions, amendments and debate. Original main motions and amendments shall be submitted in writing no later than June 20, signed by the maker and the seconder, each of whom shall be a voting member of the Congress. Discussion on pending motions will be in writing and must be germane to the motion. The member shall identify herself, her chapter and her state.

RECOMMENDATIONS AND REPORTS

Recommendations submitted by the National Board of Management shall be presented during an online business session. Recommendations submitted by committees or individuals for the expenditure of funds shall have been referred to the Executive Committee and Finance Committee no later than January 15.

All reports and other material shall be typed single-spaced and ready for printing and shall have been received by the Office of the Recording Secretary General via email or submitted in another acceptable electronic format by the close of Continental Congress.

Reports of State Regents shall be limited to two minutes each and shall be videotaped and submitted in advance. The written report of a State Regent that is not prerecorded shall be filed without being read.

Reports of National Chairs scheduled to report shall be limited to two minutes each and shall be videotaped and submitted in advance. The written report of a National Chair that is not prerecorded shall be filed without being read.

National Chairs making introductions or presenting awards shall be limited to one minute. Acceptance speeches for awards shall be limited to three minutes. Presentations and acceptance speeches shall be prerecorded and submitted in advance.

ELECTIONS

Election of officers shall take place on **Saturday, June 27, 2020**.
The *Simply Voting* portal shall open at **8:00 a.m. (ET)** and shall close at **2:00 p.m. (ET)**.

Installation of officers shall be on **Sunday, June 28, 2020**, immediately following the Memorial Service.

Seven Vice Presidents General shall be elected by ballot at Continental Congress each for a term of three years. Nominating speeches for candidates for Vice President General shall be limited to one nominator's speech of two minutes for each candidate and will be prerecorded. A plurality vote shall elect. The seven receiving the highest number of votes shall be declared elected. In the case of a tie vote, the Chair of the Tellers Committee shall draw lots. A vacancy (or vacancies) in any unexpired term in the office of Vice President General shall be filled by the candidate(s) receiving the next highest number of votes filling the longest unexpired term first to the shortest unexpired term last.

Election for Honorary Vice President(s) General shall be by ballot. One nominating speech of two minutes for each candidate shall be permitted and will be prerecorded. A plurality vote shall elect. In case of a tie, the Chair of the Tellers Committee shall draw lots.

MINUTES

The minutes of Continental Congress shall be corrected and approved by a committee appointed by the President General. The committee shall report to the Recording Secretary General who in turn shall report to the National Board of Management.

MISCELLANEOUS

Business scheduled for any Congress business session that is not completed at the time of recess of that meeting will be resumed at the next business session.

No tape or other recording may be made of the proceedings of the Congress, other than those sanctioned by the Executive Committee.

PARLIAMENTARY AUTHORITY

The rules contained in the current edition of *Robert's Rules of Order Newly Revised* shall govern the Continental Congress in all cases to which they are applicable and in which they are not inconsistent with the Bylaws and Standing Rules of this Society and these Standing Rules for Continental Congress.
