4. Introduction of the topic:

- **Warm-Up (15 minutes):**
- Show pictures of Buffalo Soldiers and ask students what they notice and what questions they have about the images.
- Discuss the background of the Buffalo Soldiers and their role in American history.

- **Introduction (15 minutes):**
- Introduce the Buffalo Soldiers and their contributions to the US Army and western expansion

5. **Procedure for instruction**:

- **Main Activity (40 minutes):**
- Divide students into small groups and provide each group with primary sources related to the Buffalo Soldiers. Have students analyze the sources and discuss the significance of the Buffalo Soldiers' presence in the American West.
- Each group presents their findings to the class.
- **Wrap-Up (15 minutes):**
- Discuss the impact of the Buffalo Soldiers on American history.
- Have students write a short reflection on what they have learned about the Buffalo Soldiers and their contributions.

6. Assessment of Understanding:

- **Assessment:**
- Students' participation in discussions and group work.
- Write a letter home from the perspective of a Buffalo Soldier. (See rubric below)
- Quality of reflections on the Buffalo Soldiers' significance.

This lesson plan is designed to engage students in learning about the Buffalo Soldiers through primary source analysis and discussions.
